SCHOOL CROSSING GUARD PROGRAM SUPERVISOR

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GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Under the general direction of the Special Operations Division Lieutenant, manages the regional coordinators and school crossing guards assigned to the school crossings. Work is routine, yet requires alertness and presence of mind in hazardous traffic situations. Persons in this position will perform traffic safety work of ordinary difficulty and have responsibility in management and training of new and existing school safety officers. Work is reviewed through observation and results obtained.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- The supervisor will be responsible for overseeing the daily activities of the regional coordinators and their assigned Crossing Guards;
- Makes arrangements with the Lieutenant to see that the program's supply needs are forwarded and fulfilled;
- Relays any safety hazards or traffic engineering problems that may be occurring at the crossings to a supervisor;
- Conducts training and/or public awareness programs on pedestrian safety and school crossing procedures;
- Serves as a liaison between Pinellas County Schools, Pinellas County Traffic Engineering, contract cities' public works departments, and the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office on school crossing matters;
- Assists with the training of personnel;
- Participates in Sheriff's Office recruitment and community relations activities as directed.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Graduation from an accredited college or university with an Associate's degree
- Or four (4) years' experience as a school crossing guard, with two (2) years' in a supervisory role
- Or equivalent combination of education and experience
- Must be able to obtain an FDOT Trainer Certification within the first 90 days of employment
- Must possess a valid Florida driver's license

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- Ability to study and understand laws, ordinances and regulations pertaining to traffic and school zones
- Good physical condition and dependability in attendance
- Interest in children's safety
- Ability to command the respect of children
- Ability to exercise tact and firmness in a courteous manner
- Ability to exercise mature judgment in emergencies
- Ability to supervise subordinates and adhere to the chain of command
- Time management skills
- Inter-personal skills
- Verbal and written communications skills
- Problem solving skills
- Ability to perform all functions of the job classification without posing a direct threat to the health or safety of other individuals in the workplace



PHYSICAL ABILITIES

The physical abilities listed below are estimates of time spent during a typical work day to perform essential functions and responsibilities. On a single shift members in this position may be required to:

- Meet the minimum hearing and vision requirements established for a School Crossing Guard as follows:
 - Have 20/40 (or better) vision in each eye
 - If one has 20/200 (or worse) vision in one eye, one must have 20/40 (or better) vision in the other eye
 - If one has 20/70 (or better) vision in either eye separately, or in both eyes together, the worst eye must have a vision screening better than 20/200
 - Must pass hearing with less than or equal to 40 decibels in each ear under the frequencies: 500hz, 1,000hz and 2,000hz
- Sit up to 2 hours per day
- Stand up to 2 hours per day
- Walk up to 2 hours per day
- Drive up to 2 hours per day
- Occasionally lift up to 25 lbs.
- Occasionally bend, squat, reach, or kneel
